- ❖ Chapter 6: Individualized Education Programs (IEPs) - this chapter gives details about what an IEP contains, who is part of the IEP team and a variety of parent tips for IEP meetings
- ❖ Chapter 8: Secondary Transition - this chapter defines Transition, describes transition services and gives tips for planning for your child beyond graduation
- ❖ Chapter 9: Behavior Intervention Plans (BIPs) - this chapter focuses on what is done for children whose behavior needs cannot be met by traditional behavior interventions; it describes Functional Assessments of Behavior and Behavior Intervention Plans in detail
- ❖ Chapter 11: Conflict Resolution - this chapter contains information regarding all stages of dispute and includes guidance on requesting mediation and due process hearings
- ❖ Appendix A: Sample Letters for Parents - this section contains sample letters to be personalized such as a request for an evaluation or IEP meeting, a positive feedback letter and a request for a due process hearing
